Responsibility of the R&DAC:

1. The committee should meet once in fort night to resolve the issues relating the research activities.
2. Necessary proposal to be submitted to the chairman for purchase requirement of project. i.e. chemicals, glassware, animals, etc.
3. If necessary ethical committee approval is to be obtained.
4. Half yearly presentation of paper/poster in international / National conferences is to be maintained.
5. To nudge and prod academics into submitting applications for externally supported R&D initiatives.
6. To encourage interdisciplinary and transdisciplinary research, the development of new products, and high-caliber publications in national and international journals.
7. To make it easier for researchers from prestigious institutions to collaborate with one another and to promote collaborative research in a variety of key areas with global and national significance.
8. To establishing and promoting MOUs with industries and R&D organizations for consulting and team-based research.
9. To encourage academics to present at events including seminars, workshops, conferences, and training programmes, as well as serve as a invited speakers.
10. To recommend peer-reviewed national and international journals for central library subscription.
11. To inform every one of any announcements made by the various government funding organizations (CSIR, DBT, DST, UGC and AICTE).
12. To inspire students to give technical presentations at conferences both domestically and internationally.
13. To send faculty members to conferences, FDPs, workshops, and seminars so they can expand their knowledge.

Policy of encouragement to employees:

The primary duties delegated to the faculty of the institution are teaching and research. Teaching is a key duty that must be carried out to the highest standard of proficiency, and this is only feasible when the faculty is actively engaged in research activities. In essence, research supports the academic programme and keeps the faculty abreast of developments in their area of specialization.

Basic Guidelines:

1. Every research proposal must go through a multi-tiered review process, with the Principal investigator/Co-Investigator reviewing it first, followed by the relevant Head of Department and department specialists.
2. Eminent researchers in the field might then review the work.
3. The R&D advisory committee should scrutinize the proposals of projects submitted by the faculty and can suggest (if necessary) for modifications.
4. The R&D Advisory committee will then review the proposal before submitting it to the funding organization.
5. The principal must be contacted for all R&D-related applications, along with one hard copy for R&D records. Additionally, a soft copy must be provided to the R&DAC.
6. All documents related to the research proposal documented properly.
7. For all R&D initiatives that are externally funded, separate stock registers and expenditures related documents must be kept in each department.
8. The Finance Officer's rules must be followed for the purchase of equipment, software, and the submission of the audit report related thereto.
9. The principal investigator and co-investigator must see to it that the software and equipment are kept in the laboratory or department and are recorded in the stock register.
10. The total sum authorized must be used in accordance with the funding agency's policies.
11. All of the purchases will continue to be an institution asset even if the principal investigator quits.

12. All department heads are required to diligently and consistently update the R&D information for their departments on the institution's website and provide reports to the R&D advisory committee time by time.

Academic Research Policy:

1. Each department's faculty members must perform research in priority areas.
2. The faculty members who publish their research in journals with the WEB OF SCIENCE or SCOPUS index are highly appreciated by the R&D advisory committee.
3. The R&D advisory committee set a goal that doctors should publish one online science and one Scopus journal, and non-doctorates should publish two Scopus indexed publications.
4. Every faculty member's research papers and publications must pass a plagiarism check.

Code of Ethics:

The following code of ethics and conduct must be followed by all participants, including students, faculty, and relevant authorities.

1. To be published in reputable journals, the research project must be entirely original.
2. All research projects must be undertaken with sufficient skill and in accordance with the relevant authorities' rules and regulations.
3. The research-based information must be supported by evidence and originality-free.
4. The research data and Information must not contain any plagiarized material.
5. All the research publication and report must contain proper Citations and acknowledgments must be properly given.
6. The article needs to be written in a clear context so that readers, editors, and reviewers can understand every argument.

Plagiarism:

The crime of plagiarism is recognized. The primary work produced by faculty, researchers, and students must be original and subject to the university's zero-tolerance plagiarism policy. An abstract, an introduction, a hypothesis, observations, results, discussion, a summary, conclusions, acknowledgements, references, etc. must all be included in the study submission report. The researcher must certify the originality of each research paper they submit and the absence of any plagiarism, providing a bibliographic reference for the copied material.

Software used for plagiarism checking: Plagiarism Checker X

In order to verify that papers like thesis, dissertations, reports, and publications are original at the time of submission, plagiarism checker X software should be utilized.






